Recycle and Garbage Bins

As noted previously, it has been noticed that residents are not bringing their bins in off the street after pick up. Please be aware, any damage done to bins that are left out are the residents responsibility and you may be responsible for the replacement cost of these bins. We ask that everyone take their bins back in off the street as soon as they are able to so they are off the streets allowing for traffic to move freely. This will also assist in the cleaning of the streets i.e. snow removal and, shortly, street sweeping.

Let's all help to keep Cupar clean and neat looking as we are proud of our community.

Street sweeping will be starting soon. Please try to remove bins and do not leave vehicles parked for extended amount of periods so we can clean with ease.

Vehicles are only allowed to park on the street ways for a period of 24 hours and as there is a parking By-law we may be forced to act upon it and have your vehicle towed at your expense if it is in the way of work areas.

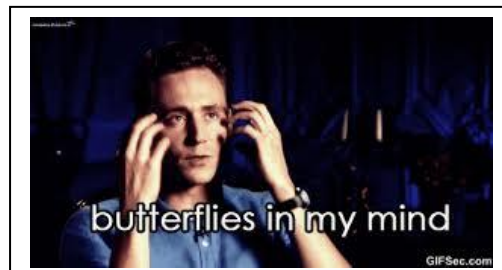
