The Cupar Transfer site will now be open Saturdays from 10-2 – weather permitting. Payment will be required cash on site.


## Community Garage Sale

#### Tent Worms of 2016

So we have all been affected by the tent worms that have happened to move into Southern Saskatchewan with a vengeance and every community has been scrambling to see what we can do to rid us of these pests.

Upon research, numerous phone calls and discussions between communities we have discovered the following:

1. The worms will not kill mature strong trees. They will strip the tree of their leaves but they will grow back. This may weaken the tree a bit as it has to focus its energy on re-growing the leaves but as we have been told, the tree should be okay. Newly planted and young trees may not be so lucky as they don't have the root system to withstand it.

- 2. The worms have a 2-3-year cycle and we were due for them. With our extremely mild winter they flourished as we did not experience the minus 40-degree temperature for the extended period that is required to kill the little buggers.
- They will be done shortly when they finally drop to the ground and start to lay their eggs. At this point you can band your trees to stop them from climbing back up for round two.
- There is a concoction that you can prepare to spray them. In an ice cream pail mix 1/2 cup sunlight dish soap, 1 cup vinegar and fill rest with water.

We all know they are pests that get under our skin but unless everyone in Southern Saskatchewan treats for them we will not be rid of them. We can try to fight them locally and hope for the best.

## Cupar Recognition Award





#### Wounded Warriors "Run to Remember"

The Wounded Warriors have been attending a weekend in Nipawin in the summer for the past several years. This year, with the encouragement of the Lieutenant Governor, a new aspect is being added. In order to continue to raise awareness of PTSD and encourage support for our injured veterans and first responders, a "Run to Remember" torch run will be held.

The kickoff will be at Government House on July 7<sup>th</sup> and the first leg will be to Southey, where they will overnight. The run then travels down #22 highway, past Cupar to overnight in Ft. Qu'Appelle on July 8th. The run will continue on to end in Nipawin on Sunday, July 24<sup>th</sup>.

We are looking for participants for the portion of the run that travels by Cupar and to carry the torch if you wish. "Run" is a loose term – you can run, walk, ride, horseback, tractor, motorcycle, quad, or group ride on a flat deck. All that really matters is forward motion. You may want to carry the torch for a veteran, your relative that served, in honour of first responders (EMT, firefighters, police) who also suffer from PTSD because of the nature of their jobs, or just because you support the cause.

Lets show that Cupar cares when this Run goes by our community. They will be stopping here for a refreshment break, sponsored by the Cupar Legion at the sports grounds. More information will be coming out, but we would love to hear from you if you are willing to participate. Contact Wes Bailey
