
In preparation we suggest to all the residents partaking in the Halloween event to do what they can to ensure our little goblins have a safe and fun evening. A few tips are:

### Cupar Snowmobile Club #303

The Cupar Snowmobile Club #303 has been around for many years and maintains the club's current shelters and approximately 200 km of groomed and marked trails for members and the public to enjoy during the winter season. The interest in snowmobiling has greatly increased over the past few years.

In order to keep this sport enjoyable for everyone, volunteers erect and remove signage on the trails, maintain the groomer and groom the trails as well as providing maintenance and stocking of the current shelters with supplies (ie. Wood, stoves, matches, paper, axes, shovels, batteries. Lights, etc).

The club would like to replace one of the aging smaller shelters with a new one. Mr. Trakalo, PAA teacher at Cupar School, was approached to see if the PAA students would construct a 20'x24' shack to be moved to a location south west of Cupar – to which they said yes. They will use this project as a school credit and therefor no cost for construction will be associated but to the club.

However, in order to complete this project there will an approximate cost of \$10,000 for the rafters, metal, lumber package, doors, windows, nails, solar lighting, bench seating, stove, etc.

If your business/organization or you individually would like to donate funds for the construction of the new shelter, you may drop off your donation at Cupar Agencies Ltd. Located at 114 Stanley Street, Cupar, SK. Please ensure that the cheque is made payable to the "Cupar Snowmobile Club" with a notation of "new shack" on it. If a receipt is required, please let us know and one will be given at a later date.
