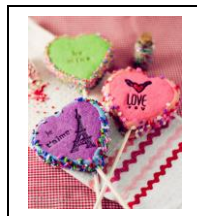

If you have a large amount of trees/branches to be hauled away you will have to find your own company or someone to haul them away to an appropriate location.

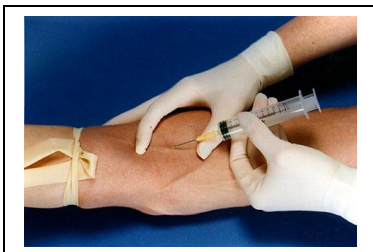
