## Please check your trees!

We have had confirmed cases of Dutch Elm Disease (DED) in Cupar for a few years now where it was slowly spreading to our Elm trees but it has greatly picked up speed where we had to remove 12+ trees. These beetles are destroying our beautiful trees.



Please look at your trees in your yard and, if Dutch Elm is confirmed, have it removed properly immediately.

### Cats a problem?

### Flower beds and cats



As a responsible, loving pet parent, you probably know that the safest, healthiest life style for your cat is to keep it indoors. However, that does not seem to be the case and is causing issues with the neighbors of those who let their cats out to roam.... which is not allowed within the Town of Cupar. Here are some tips to try to keep them out of your flower bed:

- Make digging difficult. They want soft dirt to dig so place rocks on the top to stop them;
- Add mulch as a cover that has sharp edges. Filbert shell mulch is great for this;
- Sprinkle cayenne pepper around as they do not like the smell;
- Create a different location for an outdoor litter box. This might redirect them out of your yard.

For more ideas on how to keep them out please search online as there are so many ways to keep them out of your flower bed BUT the best way if for pet parents to keep them indoors.



## Recycling changes

Loraas Disposal has changed the accepted recyclable material due to processors guideline changes. Below is a list of acceptable and non-acceptable material for your recycle bin (list available at the office):



#### **Non-Allowable Materials**

- Household garbage, organics, or hazardous waste.
- Waxed, plasticized or food contami8nated paper, cardboard cuts or plastic plates.
- Soiled tissues, napkins and paper towels.
- Confetti shredded paper.
- Styrofoam or other foam packing materials.
- Auto parts or batteries.

Please **do not** place any of the **above** listed items in the blue recycle bins as the whole truck is rejected for the recycling.

#### **Allowable Recycling Materials:**

- Flattened corrugated cardboard and paperboard (empty cereal boxes, empty detergent boxes, empty tissue boxes.
- Newspaper, flyers, junk mail and envelopes.
- Magazines, catalogues, telephone books, paperback books, hard cover books with the spine removed.
- Brown paper bags, tissue roll cores, gift and packing paper, paper egg cartons.
- Soft drink and beer cans,
- Foil trays and pie plates.
- Household tin cans (please rinse).
- Plastic containers with logo
- Plastic drink bottles.
- Aspetic packaging and cartons.
- Juice and milk cartons, milk jugs, tetra-pak containers, pouches.

#### Tree planting in 2020

We are currently planning to plant more trees in spring of 2020 to replace trees removed from Dutch Elm Disease and to add trees to areas that do not have them. If you are wanting trees planted on your boulevard please let us know so we can start with the ones that want them first. The trees are typically delivered end of April or beginning of May so contact the Town Office before those months.

#### **Utility Bills**

Utility bills are sent out at the begining of each and every month. Please ensure the office has a current mailing address because "I didn't get the bill" is not an acceptable excuse for nonpayment.

All bills are due at the end of the billing month.
