The Cupar Fire Department has their <u>CASH CALENDARS</u> on sale now! They are available from any fire department member, at the Town Office and other locations in Cupar. Stop on by and get one! You can win more than once and they make great stocking stuffers or gift for those who are hard to buy for. Or purchase one just to support the Fire Department.

The Cupar Fire Department would like to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

As per tradition, we would also like to offer some safety tips for the season:

- 1. Real Christmas Trees require a lot of water to make sure they do not dry out and become a fire hazard. Make sure they have plenty of water at all times.
- 2. Be sure to set your tree up away from exits and sources of heat.
- 3. While candles are beautiful, they are the cause of a majority of fires over the holidays. Ensure they are in a sturdy holder that will not tip over and never leave a burning candle unattended.
- 4. Don't overload electrical circuits. It's tempting at this time of year to run as many strings of decorative lights as possible. Avoid creating a dangerous electrical octopus.
- 5. Once the presents are all open, and it's time to clean up, please do not burn the gift-wrapping paper in your fireplace or woodstove. The sudden, intense heat created can start a chimney fire.
- 6. Speaking of chimneys, is yours clean? Chimneys for wood burning appliances should be cleaned annually to reduce the build up of flammable creosote. Burning dry, seasoned wood with a hot fire will also help and be sure to use a screen in front of your fireplace to prevent sparks, embers or burning wood from escaping and spreading the fire.

Keeping friends and family safe is the greatest gift. Could your elderly relatives and neighbours use some help in checking some of these items? How about your son or daughter's university accommodation? Are you still looking for gift ideas? how about a smoke alarm, fire extinguisher or carbon monoxide detector? Just a few thoughts from your local Fire Department.
