We can't wait to see what will be done next year!!!!

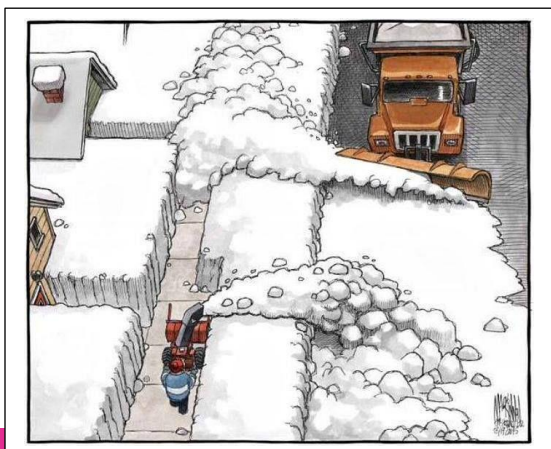

### *Snow on the roads*

When removing the snow from your driveway or sidewalk do not blow or shovel it onto the streets. This can cause issues with blowing in or an accident with vehicles. When removing your snow please keep it on your own property - be it your front yard or back yard - or remove it to a pre-approved location - just not on the streets. We try to keep the drainage runways clean when we grade and blow the streets and this can be difficult with added issues.

When we grade, use the tractor or blow the snow from the streets please keep away from our equipment. We do know the removal can cause some minor inconveniences when trying to find an alternate route but we are doing it so everyone can get around easier. Please do not crowd the equipment or get angry with our maintenance as they are doing it as fast as they can to get out of your way. When you see the flashing lights of the grader or tractor, think ahead and see if you can avoid the area while they work.

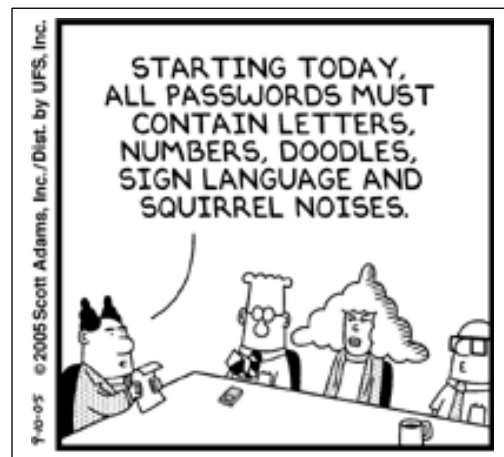
**Forever in Motion exercise is every Monday, Wednesday and Friday 9am-10am in the Town Hall. Everyone is Welcome!!!**

10:00-6:00. All visitors are appreciated and welcome to attend and participate in Cupar library activities.

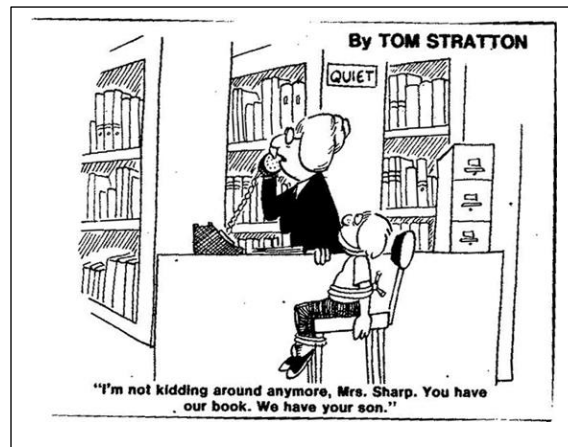
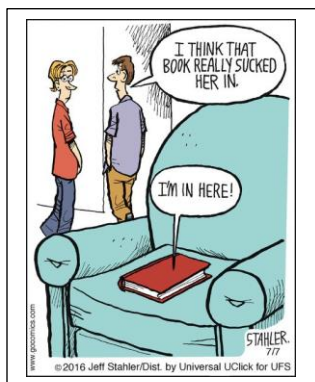
