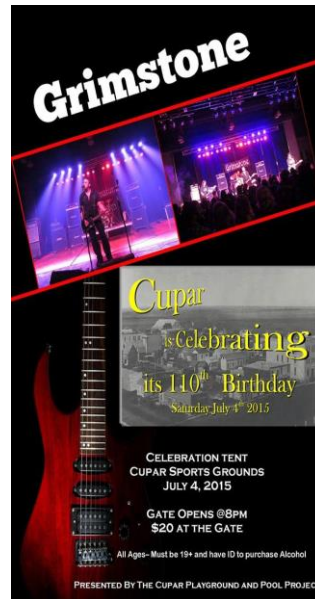

Cupar is turning 110 years old and we are going to have tons of fun with many events going on!

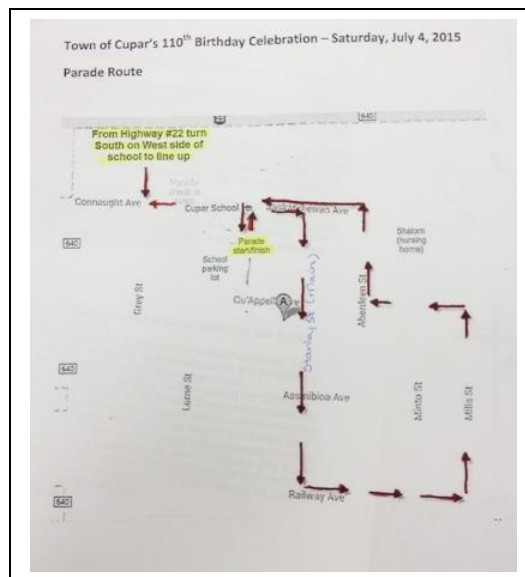

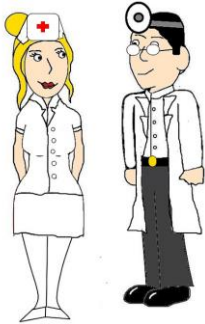

your bags out there but we do ask that you split the bags and dump them while placing the bags in the red bin.

Street Sweeping

The town maintenance crew will be working hard on street sweeping as well as beautifying the town. Please do your part by minimizing the parking on the streets. Please follow the Bylaw parking no longer than 24 hours as this will assist in having nothing in the way of the sweeper.

Parking

Parking on the streets is only allowed for 24 hour periods and then the vehicle has to be moved.

Complaints have been received for camper trailers and vehicles that have been parked for an excessive amount of time. To ensure you do not receive fines please move your vehicles to a proper location to be stored when not in use.

We do have areas that are deemed NO PARKING ZONES and we further ask you to adhere to these laws.

For your knowledge: Pets that are caught running loose against our Bylaw are not 'disposed of'. We attempt to locate their owners. As of now untagged animals may be taken to the Humane Society where their owners can pick them up for a fee.

Recycle and Garbage bins

Garbage days are every Wednesday and Recycle bins are picked up according to the Recycle pick-up calendar – or every 4 weeks on Tuesdays.

Please have your bins out

to the curb the evening prior to the pick-up date to make sure you do not miss the truck.

We also ask that everyone please remove their bins from the street so they are not run over or hit by

vehicles. The bins, if damaged by tossing around in the wind or neglect, will be charged to the homeowner.

July 7th is recycle Day.

Utility Billing

Just a reminder, all utility bills are due at the end of each billing month.

Water meter reads need to be in the Town Office no later than the 25th of

that month to ensure they can be entered into that billing. Late water meter reads will not be used.
