Cupar Library

Cupar Library was surprisingly and secretly selected as a grant recipient in memory of the late Dr. Stuart Maddin. He lived here in the 1920s to mid-30s as the son of a pharmacist, Dr. Maxwell Maddin who then sold his business to Dr. Stuart and then moved to Vancouver. Dr. Stuart Maddin became a world famous dermatologist and traveler, and died at age 95 last year. His colleagues chose Cupar Library because of the stories and memories he shared of his early childhood experiences here, and how his path in life was enriched by reading books from the library. A delegation of his colleagues were attending a medical convention in Saskatoon from June 22-26, when 5 decided to travel to Cupar and look up his home and the library on June 24. The

board held a welcome lunch, and the delegation presented them with a cheque and stipulation that it is only to be spent on furthering the education and health resources of the library for the community, such as health/science/technology books and presentations. As well, two of Dr. Maddin's books were donated – his memoirs and a dermatology book. Once they are barcoded, then they are available to the community for use. We thank the Cipher Pharmaceutical Company and Chronicles Company and Linacre's Books for their thoughtfulness and generosity. Thanks to all Library Board Members for their fast work in putting the lunch together, and to Mayor Boha for his support! Ideas for books and presentations are welcome through the Cupar Library.

Our open hours are Wednesdays and Fridays from 10:30-5, and our phone number is 306-723-4749. Library cards are free to anyone over 5 years of age; a public computer is available for free use too.

We thank the Town of Cupar and its workers for the wonderful job they did to fix up the front of the building's lawn. Thanks to Vera Rakai and her daughters Diane and Monna for the beautiful flower displays.

Come on out for food, baseball, drinks and great fun on a Saturday afternoon!

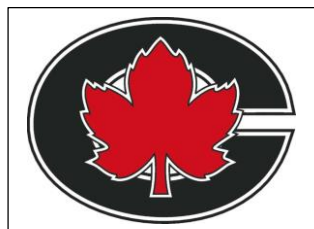

Cupar Canucks 2nd Annual Baseball Tournament

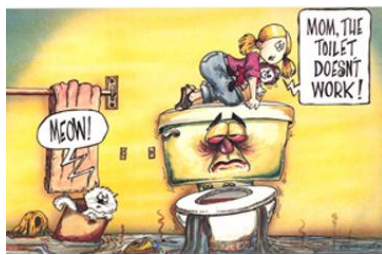

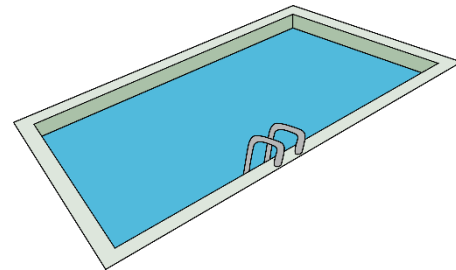


Parking

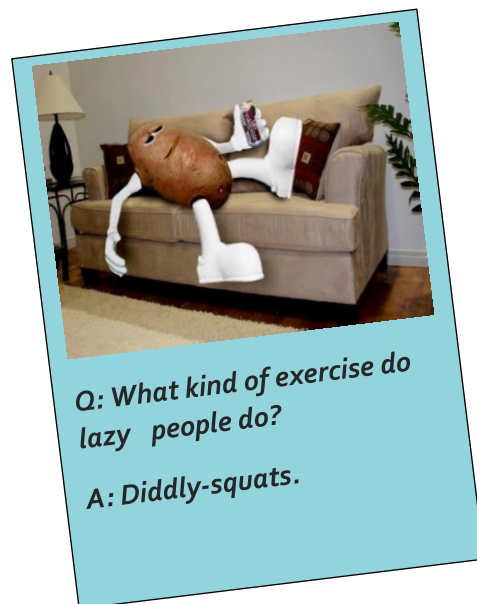
We do have areas that are deemed NO PARKING ZONES and we further ask you to adhere to these laws.

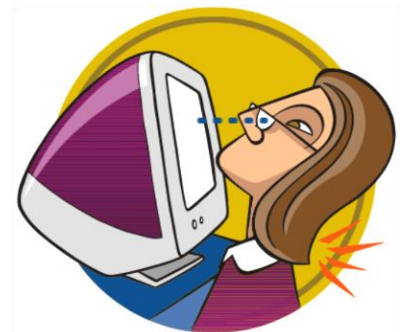
