MUSEUM NEWS

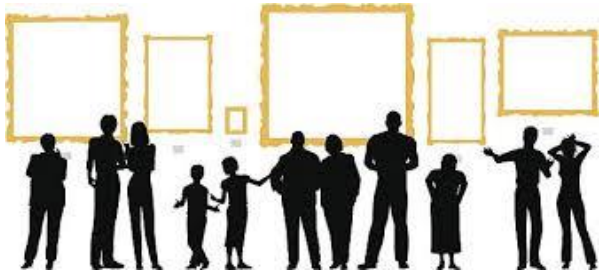

DUTCH ELM DISEASE



Dutch Elm Disease



Overview

Dutch Elm Disease (DED) is caused by fungus that attacks American elm (*Ulmus americana*), and sometimes Siberian elm (*Ulmus pumila*) trees. The fungus can be carried by elm bark beetles, contaminated pruning tools, or by the root systems of other infected elm trees. DED blocks the vascular system of the tree, causing it to die within a few years, sometimes within a few weeks. Since there are no known cures for infected trees, preventative measures must be taken.

Stop Dutch Elm Disease now!

Urban forests and trees provide a broad array of well-known environmental, economic, and social benefits that include sequestering of CO₂ and pollutants, shade and cooling, noise buffering, wildlife habitat, increased property values and psychological well-being. Don't let Dutch Elm Disease decrease the value of your urban forest! *There are ways to treat and prevent the disease.*

Symptoms

Early symptoms include sections of wilted green leaves, that eventually turn yellow, dry up and fall off the tree.

Another way to ascertain if a tree is infected is to remove a branch and strip off the bark—on infected trees dark brown streaking can be seen on the sapwood.

Did You Know?

- ◆ Pruning elm trees is prohibited between April 1 and August 31 without a permit
- ◆ Storage and transportation of elm firewood is prohibited without a permit
- ◆ After an elm tree has been removed, the stump must either be removed or treated
- ◆ After an elm tree has been removed, it must be disposed of in a designated elm tree disposal site

DUTCH ELM DISEASE

Forsite Treatment Management

Forsite coordinates and facilitates infected tree management by assisting interested municipalities throughout the province to survey elm trees in their area in order to slow the spread of DED via targeted treatments.

We perform detailed tree inventories of every elm in a municipality, from which we create a map layer using GIS that shows the exact (GPS) location of each tree. This inventory provides the basis for a municipal monitoring program to assist in managing shade trees and possible elm replacements in urban areas.

Treatment Options

Fungicide Injections

A fungicide is injected directly into the base of the tree. It is most commonly used in high-value elms, since it is one of the more expensive treatment options.

Although these are mainly used for the control of cankerworms, other insects weaken the trees they attack. When a tree is weakened, it becomes more susceptible to other diseases, such as DED.



Insecticide Spray

An insecticide containing the ingredient "chlorpyrifos" is sprayed on the lower 25cm of the tree. This prevents the beetles from overwintering for up to two years.

BYLAW OFFICER

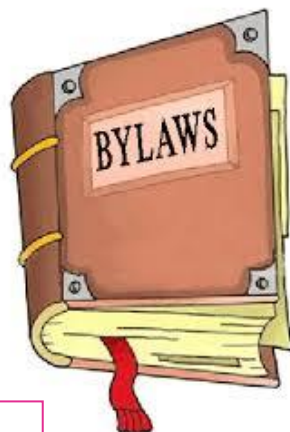
The Town of Cupar would like to welcome our new bylaw officer!

SUMMER WATER SAFETY TIPS

For many families, summer includes activities such as boating and swimming. Talking to your family and small children is a must about water safety. Though important, swimming skills alone aren't always enough to save a life. Many drowning incidents involve other factors that swimming skills alone cannot prepare an individual for. Learning water safety-such as how to prepare for an emergency, and what to do if one should occur-is key to preventing an emergency in or on the water. It's swimming skills combined with safety knowledge and skills that saves lives.

Backyard pools

Backyard pools are especially dangerous for small children. Ensure adequate barriers are in place such as four-sided fencing along with a self-closing, self-latching gate.

Empty portable toddler pools after each use.

Diving

Avoid diving in home pools and always enter the water feet-first.

Open water

Never underestimate the power of current.

Swimmers or waders can be swept away in an instant, particularly if non-swimmers or weak swimmers get caught by current in rivers or out of their depth in abrupt drop-offs.

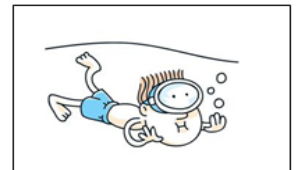

FUN FACTS!!

TENT WORMS

This year the tent worms are expected to be the same if not worse for tent worms than last year. Now that we all know what to expect this is a bit of information about them that will hopefully help.

. The worms will not kill mature, healthy trees. They will strip the trees of their leaves but they will grow back. This may weaken the tree a bit as it has to focus its energy on re-growing the leaves. Newly planted and young trees may not withstand these worms as well as mature trees.

-The worms have a 2-3-year cycle (we survived 1 year already!!). With our second mild winter in a row they made it through, as we did not experience the minus 40-degree temperature for an extended period of time to kill these bugs.

-The town maintenance crew has banded tons of trees around Cupar to help with controlling the number of the tent worms. This helps for the second round of the worms as they cannot as easily go up the trees to lay another set of eggs. The eggs are laid in groups of 150 to 350!!

-There is a concoction that you can prepare to spray them. In an ice cream pail mix 1/2 cup sunlight dish soap, 1 cup vinegar and fill rest with water.

Destroying cocoons and egg masses

(Information from Government of Canada Website)

In the spring, if webs are present, colonies of young larvae can be removed by clipping and destroying the tents and caterpillars. This is best done when the caterpillars are at rest in the tent, either in early morning, late evening, or on cool rainy days. A pole pruner can be used to remove the nests in taller trees.

In the summer, look for tough, yellow-to-white cocoons on tree trunks, fences, debris, and sheltered areas. In the fall, look for shiny, dark brown or gray saddle-like cases which straddle or encase twigs of trees that are known to be susceptible to tent caterpillar infestations. Destroy egg cases and cocoons by scraping them off carefully (to avoid damage to the bark), and dispose of them in a sealed bag.
