WHAT'S NEW IN CUPAR Water Meter Upgrade

The Town of Cupar has been fortunate to receive a grant for the upgrade of our water meters in the amount of \$100,000.00. This grant will allow the water to be metered properly and provide a more accurate reading to better serve our residents. Water is an important and a required part of living so we understand how the cost

of it can be daunting. This upgrade will help you better understand where and when you are using water. More information will be provided when we are up and running but right at the moment we are in the installation stage. In the mail, you should have received a letter from Corix, the company we purchased the meters from, and the same company that is completing the installation. On that letter is a contact number you

will call to arrange an appointment for the Corix rep to come and install the new meter. We know people are busy and work away from home so they are accommodating this with evening and weekend appointments - but cannot do so without you calling in to make an appointment. They will be door knocking as well however it is easier and smoother to arrange a convenient time if the homeowner calls in. In the event you have not received the letter some will be available at the Town Office or we will have the numbers for you to call to schedule that appointment. PLEASE KEEP IN MIND this meter change is REQUIRED so please call in and get this completed. If a new meter is refused, you run this risk of the water being shut off until the exchange occurs as it is required by our Bylaw to have a meter to have access to town water. Thank you for understanding and ensuring the Corix representative is allowed to complete his work in a timely fashion.

CUPAR BALL DIAMOND

A Cupar Ball Diamond Project Committee was organized to work with the Town of Cupar, current ball teams and members of past teams with a mandate to raise funds to erect new galvanized fencing and install red shale infields. Due to the age of the wood fencing around the diamonds, they have become a safety issue and need to be replaced.

Thus far, the committee has raised enough funds to start erecting new fencing/mesh and new dugouts on the south diamond.

As a way to raise funds, the committee is reaching out to everyone that played ball or is playing ball on the diamonds and community at large to consider donating \$50 towards purchasing 8'6" line/terminal fence posts. A tax receipt will be available and your name will be placed on a signboard that will be located at Shore Park.



SNOW REMOVAL

We are in the process of preparing for warmer weather and getting ready for water run-off. We are asking all residents to please work with us by moving your vehicles off the street so when we are ready to peel away the snow and ice we can do so without obstructions. We do have a Bylaw that does not allow street parking for longer than 24 hours and, if we are forced to, will implement this Bylaw by towing vehicles. We will attempt to reach the owner first however, please be advised that we have been given no choice but to enforce this when we are called.

Further, we have noticed an increase of residents trying to go around the town equipment when they are in the process of removing snow and/or grading OR boxing our equipment in whiles they are trying to move! This is very dangerous as the equipment only allows for minimal visual radiuses and when the vehicles come up to it or around it, they cannot see you. This runs a MAJOR risk to the resident and anyone who is around as the operator cannot see you or react quickly enough to avoid contact. PLEASE PLEASE stay a reasonable distance away from our equipment, use a different road when you are able or allow them the right of way to avoid any completely avoidable accidents. This can be prevented as long as the residents use proper discretion and stay away from the working equipment.



TREE TRIMMING

Our Maintenance Team will be beginning to trim trees that have to be done before April 1st. Please watch for them and stay out of their way as falling branches are always a possibility. Better to be safe than sorry.
