Tax Notices were sent out in July so to get your best deal, payment should be received within the month of November to get the discount off of the Municipal portion. The discount will be gone the end of this month with the full Municipal portion to be paid in December.

Please note – Any payments made online may not necessarily make it to our office that same day. It can take up to 5 business days to be received so if you make your payment for taxes (or utilities for that matter) on the last day of the month they will not make it to us until the following month.

In order to receive any discounts on your taxes or avert any interest charges, payments must be received in the office prior to month end.
