Utility Bills are sent out at the beginning of each and every month and are due at the end of each billing month. Please be aware that if unpaid bills occur you will run the risk of your water being shut off until payment or arrangements have been made.

The water meters will be read every second month to ensure overages are better handled and we trust you will cooperate and ensure our maintenance team or office will receive your reading.

Tax notices were sent out in July. To receive the most of your discount we encourage to get payment into the office prior to November 31st when the discount disappears. All notices are due no later than December 31st. After December 31st, all invoices will accrue monthly interest charges.
