

What is happening in Cupar......

- Grey and blue bins have been left out on the roadways. Please make sure they are returned to your property to prevent damage and blowing around. Set them out the night before to ensure pick up is completed as Loraas can show up very early.
- Parking on the street for longer that a 24-hour period is not permitted. Any vehicles that are parked longer run the risk of being towed at the owner's expense.
- Biodegradable bags will no longer be available at the Town Office once the stock runs out.
- The transfer site is still open on Saturdays from 10-2 weather permitting but we are nearing the end of this season. If you plan to take anything out make sure it is done asap as our closing will come fast.
- We will be sweeping the streets as the leaves fall. Please make sure your vehicles are out of the way and DO NOT blow your leaves to the road. This plugs up our drainage system.


Similar to a book club but with Food! We will get together 3 times a year to enjoy each other food (pot luck style) and share our recipes.


