The town does offer incentives to keep some of that money in your own pocket by way of discounts on the Municipal portion if paid in certain months.

July & August – 5% discount

September – 4.5% discount

October – 4% discount

November – 3% discount

Ball Diamond # 4 upgrade is nearing completion.

Dugouts have been rebuilt with metal frames, metal outer shell and concrete floor pads.

Galvanized posts and chain link fencing has been erected.

Work that is to be completed:

- Hang new chain link mesh on back stop.
- Add infield material and level.
- Add top soil in right field and level, plant grass seed.
- Landscape around diamond.



Upon completion of Diamond #4, work will begin on Diamond #3 with the dismantling of wooden fencing and fence chain link mesh.

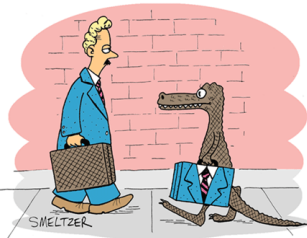
