Fire at Cupar Town Hall

The adjustor came out the next day to assess the damage. He had Restorex out by that afternoon to begin the clean-up and removal of damage in our kitchen. They have been working for weeks, cleaning and painting in our hall and refurbishing anything that was damaged by the smoke.

Cupar History

"Residents of Cupar had electric lights available to them as early as 1920 through the facilities of Harry Brown's light plant. Harry was a local citizen and his home and plant were located on Main Street. The street lights came on at dusk and were shut off at 11 p.m. each week night and 12 p.m. on Saturday night. In September 1929 Montreal Engineering came in and had the power franchise until 1940 when Prairie Power took over. SaskPower has provided this service since January 1945.″

Water and Low Yards

As the snow is melting, the heavy rains have fallen and more wet snow has arrived we have been receiving many calls about standing water in yards. We have been going above and beyond by providing pumps making sure the water has been pumped away. .

If your yard is lower than the roadway/back alley it is your responsibility to ensure you do not flood and use a pump yourself as our town workers are busy working on public areas.

We all have to work together and step up to make sure Mother Nature does not disrupt our yards and roadways.

A solution to this issue is to possibly raise your property making sure the water flows properly into existing storm drains. Please do not make the water run into your neighbor's yard as this will cause further grief.

Without proper access to the sewer lines, the plumbers are unable to guarantee a complete cleanout of the lines. The town will not be responsible for any incurred costs related to these cleanings regardless where the blockage occurs.

It is the homeowners' responsibility to ensure that both the area for performing the work is available as well as the 4'' access to the sewer line.
